Main Duties and Responsibilities

The coaches will

1. Work closely with the Down GAA and County Games and Coaching Committee.
2. Proactively engage with schools to encourage their involvement in the Down GAA Schools Coaching Programme.
3. Provide Coaching Support and Assistance to Down GAA Clubs.
4. Implement a structured programme that focuses on Gaelic Games to key stage 1 and 2.
5. Provide Coaching Support and Assistance to 2nd level Schools.
6. Work as a lead Coach within the Down GAA Mourne Academy Programme.
7. Work closely with teachers to develop their confidence in delivering physical literacy and games.
8. Implement blitzes / tournaments between schools on a regional basis.
9. Facilitate the development of school / club links to encourage after school activities and transfer into club activity.
10. Implement extra-curricular activities in school and deliver club development programmes.
11. Attend Down GAA staff development programmes and be involved in summer scheme programmes outside of normal term time.

Coaches will be allocated to a specified geographical area to deliver the programme to schools in that region.
